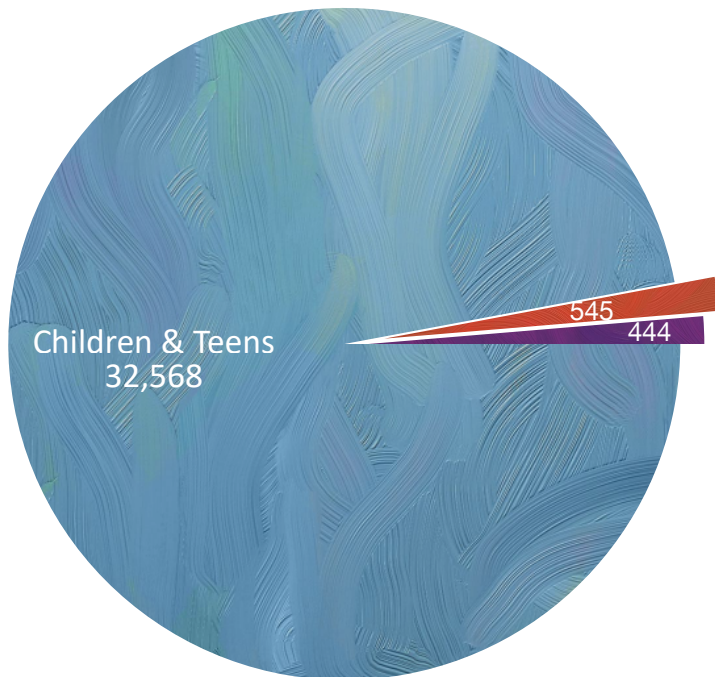

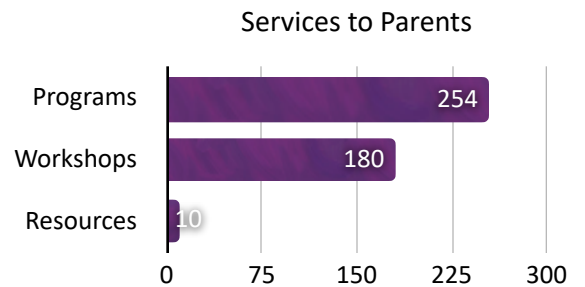
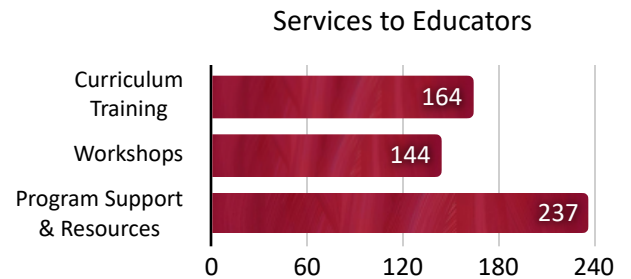
Our Successes

1. We exceeded our program goals. This year, we presented 2 Info sessions, 10 curriculum training sessions for Stand Strong * Stay Safe, and 16 interactive workshops for parents. We collaborated with 18 school districts through training, webinars, online resources, and outreach; programs were taught to students in 9 of them. ChildBuilders programs were taught at 83 public schools, 14 head start centers, and 5 private or charter schools and other organizations. In total, we served 32,568 children, 444 parents, and 545 educators at 156 public schools, charter schools, private schools, Head Start centers, and other organizations
2. We successfully launched the Building Pathways for Healthy Minds program, which fills a gap in our programming to teach parents, educators, and other adults the mental health, trauma, and mindfulness skills that are critical to their ability to support the children in their lives - especially in the wake of the pandemic. Through this program, we offered workshops and webinars in the following topics: young children's mental health, mindfulness, parenting through trauma, using empathy in discipline, and recognizing and responding to child abuse. These programs were offered simultaneously in English and Spanish. Recordings of these sessions are available on our website in English and Spanish with closed captioning for anyone interested in mentally healthy parenting and caregiving for young children.
3. Our Stand Strong • Stay Safe program for PreK-5th Grade is now aligned with the new Health Education TEKS and the 6 Pillars of Character Education from Character Counts.
4. Our Professional Development Catalog is published for 2023 with attached cost sheet and available on our website. This document makes it much easier for our district contacts to book training and purchase curricula and materials.
5. We became an approved vendor with ESC Region 11, Pasadena ISD, and Cypress-Fairbanks ISD, a process that is already opening doors to additional school districts. Approved vendor status indicates that we are compliant with federal policies that school districts are obliged to follow.
6. We continue to offer CPE credits through TEA for teachers and school counselors and CEU credits for teachers, social workers, and LPC's.
7. We streamlined our programmatic and financial records management over the last two years. Our ability to accurately collect program data and keep in touch with school-based partners is greatly improved this year. Our new system allows us to report information related to our programs and our fundraising much more efficiently and comprehensively.

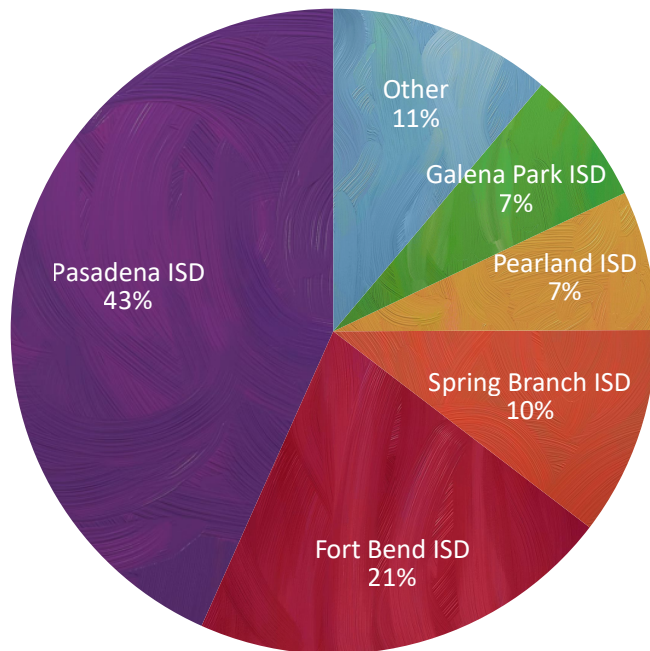

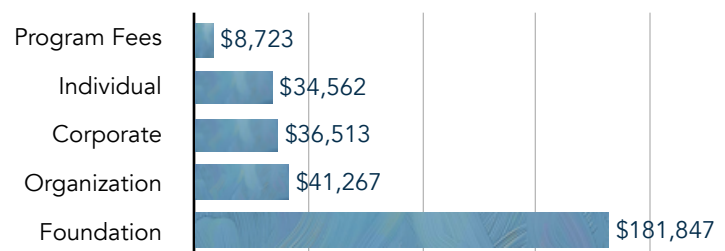
